Pastor’s Corner: This past week at our annual pastors’ workers meetings, one of our pastors did the worship and his topic was about ‘Ingratitude’. As he was speaking, I was convicted once again how important our relationship with Jesus our Savior is. We all face difficulties during our lifetime that shape our thinking about life and those around us. Ingratitude can make us grumpy, unhappy people filled with resentment, and that God does not care. But gratitude, friend is the key to unlocking the essence of peace within our hearts.

In Ephesians 5:20, the Apostle Paul exhorts believers to “*give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ*”. This simple yet profound command serves as the foundation for understanding the connection between gratitude and inner peace.

The Bible consistently reinforces the importance of gratitude in maintaining a peaceful heart. 1 Samuel 12:24 encourages us to “*fear the Lord and serve him faithfully with all your heart. For consider what great things he has done for you.*” This verse reminds us that when we reflect on the blessings and the goodness of God, a grateful heart naturally emerges, leading to a sense of peace that transcends circumstances. Gratitude will shape and transform our worship experience, and even strengthen you in serving Him faithfully. Paul emphasizes the transformative power of gratitude in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, “*Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.*”

Friends, gratitude is not contingent on favorable circumstances; rather, it is a continuous and intentional choice to acknowledge God's sovereignty in every situation. By cultivating a habit of gratitude, we align our hearts with God's will and experience a peace that surpasses understanding, and that will transform your everyday worship experience.

The connection between gratitude and peace is clear - a heart that is continually thankful is a heart that is open to receiving and embracing the peace that Christ offers. In Steps to Christ we read, “*Gratitude will unlock the door of your heart that the peace of God may come in.*” Blessings, Pastor Vernon

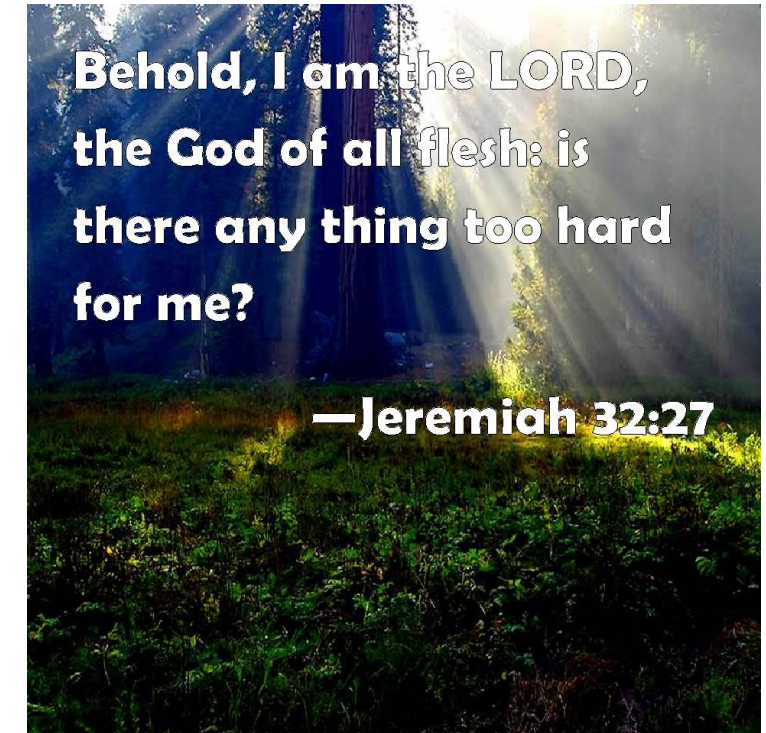
